

Dr. Joeva Barrow, PhD, RD

Dr. Joeva Barrow is a 3 time Gator Graduate! She earned a Bachelor's degree in Food Science & Human Nutrition (emphasis Dietetics) in 2005. She entered the MS-DI program and completed her Master's Degree in Nutritional Sciences in 2008. Dr. Barrow states, "I completed the MS-DI program in FSHN with an option to complete a research thesis. Through the labs of Dr. Gail Kauwell and then Dr. Mitchell Knuston, I became infatuated with the research method and the world of molecular nutrition and biochemistry and knew this was how I wanted to contribute to nutrition in the future." From there, she pursued a PhD in Medical Sciences: Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, earning her Doctorate degree in 2013. Leaving the warm weather of the South, along with the "brilliant and collaborative minds" at UF, Dr. Barrow knew that "Gainesville will always be a home for me." She advanced to complete Postdoctoral training at Harvard Medical School/ Dana-Farber Cancer Institute in Cell Metabolism and Cancer Biology in 2018. Dr. Barrow currently serves as an Assistant Professor of Nutritional Sciences at Cornell University. Recently, Dr. Barrow's lab was selected as the Cornell research feature, "Tackling Mitochondria-Based Diseases." Related to her research on mitochondria, Dr. Barrow also studies metabolic disease in relation to obesity. Dr. Barrow's research is fascinating, and we would encourage you to check out her amazing contributations to science here.

Congratulations to **Dr. Stacey Mobley!** He recently received the **Certified Nutrition Support Clinician**® **(CNSC®)** credential from the National Board of Nutrition Support Certification (NBNSC). This credential demonstrates an individual's competency in providing safe and effective clinical nutrition care, including highly complex tube feeding and parenteral/intravenous feeding. Earners of the CNSC® credential are physicians, dietitians, nurses, pharmacists, and physician assistants, who have attained the skills necessary to provide quality nutrition support care, and have passed a rigorous exam. The CNSC® is an international credential established by the American Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (ASPEN), and it is the most visible and widely recognized nutrition support certification. **Dr. Mobley** joined the faculty in August 2018, and he teaches many of our nutrition courses, including HUN2201, HUN3403, HUN4445, and HUN4446.

Dr. Andrew MacIntosh (pictured with Dean Elaine Turner) joined the FSHN faculty in July 2017, and since the beginning, he has been an unstoppable force in the department. Although he has numerous accomplishments to date, his support of students - both undergraduate students and graduate students - may be the highest accolade.
